## Pathways

### To UConn ECE Instructor Certification



#### CONTENT SPECIFIC ADVANCED DEGREE

As the only National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships (NACEP) accredited program in Connecticut, UConn ECE Instructors must meet the same requirements as adjunct UConn Faculty. In some instances, this requires candidates to hold both a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in desired course content.



#### ADVANCED DEGREE IN EDUCATION

In many instances, across numerous Departments, educators with content specific Bachelor's Degrees and Advanced Degrees in Education may be eligible for ECE Instructor certification. We encourage potential applicants to review Department specific requirements to explore certification eligibility.



#### GRADUATE COURSEWORK SCHOLARSHIP

UConn Early College Experience offers scholarships to teachers who are interested in UConn ECE certification but are missing one or two required courses. The scholarship allows interested teachers to take graduate courses or necessary undergraduate courses in their content areas to become more qualified candidates for certification.



#### BECOME AN INSTRUCTOR

UConn ECE offers partner schools access to 87 different course offerings, across 5 Schools and 36 University Departments. We encourage potential applicants to review Department specific requirements to explore certification eligibility.
