



Transitioning to "college ready" is easier

And with an understanding of the value of a course syllabus where expectations and responsibilities are laid out in a single document. Grades are recorded on an official UConn transcript that can be transferred to the college of your choice 87% of the time.

And, you'll have the confidence of knowing that you have already started that journey.



In the comfort of your classroom

A 300-seat lecture hall in your first year of college?

No thank you. Take UConn courses in a setting that is both familiar and conducive to learning – your high school classroom. You'll be in your environment, with instructors who know you and can offer the support you need. Lab sections are integrated into the class – not across campus with a teaching assistant. Low student-to-teacher ratios often result in greater academic success.

Expert Instructors

Go ahead, call your UConn ECE Instructor "Professor." They deserve it.

Not just anyone can teach a UConn course. High school teachers who want to offer more opportunities for their students submit an application which is reviewed by that discipline's academic department; UConn ECE Instructors are only permitted to teach a UConn course at your school if they meet the same qualifications as UConn faculty that teach on campus. Not only that, but they attend professional development workshops on campus, interact directly with UConn faculty in their academic department, and participate in online forums. They are the real deal.

High School Site Representatives

Not sure which UConn courses to take at your school or how to register? We've got that covered. Your school has a designated UConn ECE Site Representative. Often a school counselor, your Site Rep will provide you with program information, guide you through the registration process, and assist you throughout your journey as a concurrent enrollment student. They are your very own "go to" person.
