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



#### Between August 28 - October 6

Students must drop in UConn.DualEnroll.com for any fall, spring, or full-year course. Paid program fees will be refunded.

#### After October 6

Courses not dropped in UConn.DualEnroll.com by October 6 require a Withdrawal request to be submitted. Program fees for courses dropped after October 6 are non-refundable.

Fall course withdrawal requests due by **December 12** Spring & full-year course withdrawals due by **May 1**



#### REGISTRATION: August 28, 2023 – October 6, 2023

TO DROP A COURSE: On or before October 6, log into your DualEnroll account and drop. Paid program fees will be refunded. All drop requests after October 6 will be processed as withdrawals and fees will not be refunded.

#### PROGRAM FEES: 1 credit course - \$50 2 credit course - \$100 3 credit course - \$150 4 credit course - \$200

### Waiver Eligibility Verification

#### Free or Reduced Meals

Yes/No Eligibility will be verified by Site Representatives using the district's Direct Certification System reporting data

### Direct Certification Data

Dual Credit Programs (UConn ECE) are considered part of CSDE Accountability System allowing the sharing of Yes/No eligibility data

### Messaging

"Free Lunch" vs. Free or Reduced-Priced meals in accordance with Federal Income Guidelines



Direct Certification is a process utilized by all local educational agencies (LEAs) to certify eligible children for free meals without the need for household applications.

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
   Program (SNAP)
- Temporary Family Assistance (TANF)
- Medicaid (coded as free Medicaid (FM) or reduced Medicaid (RM))

The district has access to this data for CSDE reporting deadlines and a district's <u>direct</u> <u>certification contact</u> person may access this information at any time.

Third Party Billing




