



UConn ECE & NACEP ACCREDITATION QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

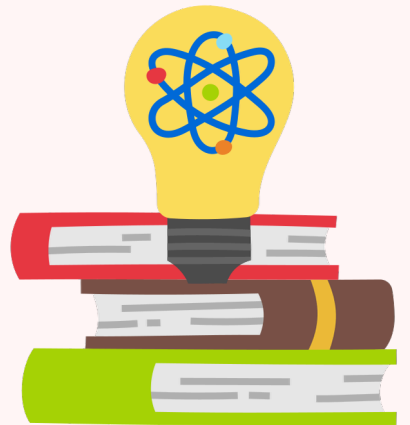
As a UConn ECE Instructor you offer a UConn course; it just happens to be located at your high school. Course comparability is a critical component of the program's NACEP accreditation, helping maintain an **87%** transferability rate for coursework taken through UConn ECE.

ECE Instructors are responsible for the following NACEP standards:

SYLLABUS (STANDARD A1)

The department and ECE office will give you guidance, but make sure the UConn information is included, grading information is clear, and it follows departmental guidelines. Have one syllabus for each course.

A course syllabus helps students transfer credit!



GRADING (STANDARD A2)

All grading standards must be aligned with discipline specific UConn department's standards. If you have a question, ask your Faculty Coordinator.

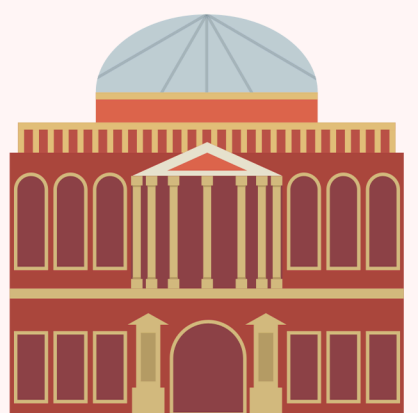
Make sure you know whether a 93% is an A or A- in your department.



ACADEMIC FREEDOM (STANDARD A3)

Some disciplines will prescribe the student assessments and assignments, while others give guidelines for assignments while stressing quality indicators. Never hesitate to contact your Faculty Coordinator for clarification on this topic.

Assessments and assignments need to meet the requirements & philosophy of the department.



SITE VISITS (STANDARD C3)

Your Faculty Coordinator is required to visit and observe your UConn class. This is a good opportunity to meet your Faculty Coordinator one-on-one and ask questions. This is also a great time to show off your class!
